This week we will be focusing on Easter and Jesus, the man.

So often, when we think of Jesus, the son of God. We can think of all of the wondrous things He did, His life changing spirit and the miracles He performed. We can sometimes forget that he was equally human too.

It is when we are reminded of Jesus' humanity that we can find a way to connect with Him on a whole different level.

In our lives, there are so many emotions and experiences we can have and as followers of Jesus we so often lift them to Him, for His help and guidance. Understanding that Jesus actually understands and can relate to us brings things into a whole new perspective. To lift our pain to Him and feel understood is such a wonderful gift.

One of the biggest things we need as humans is to be understood.

At Easter, we can be reminded of Jesus' humanity even more powerfully. God gave Jesus, His only son as a sacrifice for sin. Jesus would give His life for the salvation of all man-kind. This Easter Sunday, we celebrate that Jesus rose again and through His Holy Spirit remains with us and in us eternally. Through the crucifixion and the time that led up to this we can also see Jesus's humanity even more clearly.

We witness Jesus feeling all of the human qualities that we experience. Fear, when he begged God to save Him from His fate. "Take this cup from me," He called out. The "cup" representing the suffering He was about to endure. Betrayal when Judas gave Him the kiss that would seal His fate. Loneliness when His friends, the disciples, failed to stay awake with Him the night before His death as they rested in the garden of Gethsemane. Pain, as He endured the cruel torture of His persecutors and despair as He hung from the cross taking upon Himself the sins of all man-kind as He slowly died.

Jesus understands us because He too has felt the things we feel. He himself knew the full range of human emotion. We can see this at so many times throughout the Gospel.

It is so important to remind ourselves that it wasn't some super hero that was crucified on the cross but rather, a man, fully human while also being the Son of God. It is a powerful reminder of the level of sacrifice that was made for us all. And in His suffering, we as human's can also, on some level, realise all of the difficult emotions Jesus would have experienced. Despite all of this, He still fulfilled God's plan.
Easter Sunday represents new beginnings and new hope. It celebrates, and we rejoice in, the empty tomb as Jesus rose again and is alive with us today. At Pentecost Jesus' ascended to Heaven and left His Holy Spirit with us but this didn't mean that He lost all His understanding of the humanity he had experienced. He will have kept all of that with Him. He would have had such a wonderful understanding of the human heart and all of the feelings it feels.
What does the empty tomb mean to you?

A new beginning doesn't always mean all that took place before is lost, it is so often used to help others as. No pain, no loss and no sadness is ever wasted. God uses everything of what we experience.

Understanding that Jesus was human too, has helped me so much in my own life. When talking to Jesus about the difficult times I am facing, I so often try and remind myself that I am talking to another heart that truly feels and connects with my pain because He too has experienced it. He has been in the wilderness; He has known despair and He also rose again. That is why Jesus loves us all to talk to Him about everything in our lives because His love has no limits. That is also why it is important to tell others of the good news that Jesus is alive today and that He wants each one of us to share our lives with Him.


- 1. Are there things in your life that you think Jesus may not understand?
